

e witnessed a mixed grill of events in our country Nigeria and indeed the world.Our editorial team has been able to capture some of these events since they are newsworthy.

June 5, 2021, marked a 'watershed' when Nigerian government officially put an indefinite ban on Twitter, restricting it from operating in Nigeria after the social media platform deleted tweets by the



Nigerian President, Muhammadu Buhari. The tweet was said to have sent a warning to the Southeastern people of Nigeria predominantly Igbo what their secession mission could do to the country.

Expectedly, the ban was condemned by Amnesty International, the British and Canadian Missions, and the Swedish Embassy in Nigeria as a step to gag the press and Nigerians' freedom of speech.

On the contrary, the Minister of Information and Culture, Alhaji Lai Mohammed stated the ban would be lifted once Twitter submitted to local licensing, registration and other legal conditions regulating the operations of the press.

We also witnessed the introduction of Mop-up Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) for 18,000 candidates in some selected locations through text messages as notification to affected students.

The rapid adoption of social media has led to a rise in informationsharing among users, with fake news becoming a major component of our digital daily routines. The spread of misinformation is in part attributed to social media failing to verify the authenticity of a news item. This makes it easy to share seemingly real images and videos which have been skillfully manipulated.

I must also mention that the contributions of the Crescent University Alumni to the growth of the institution is recognized.

'Our College of Health Sciences will Meet Global Standards' - Vice Chancellor

rescent University, Abeokuta College of Health Sciences (COHES) has been established to contribute to the production of qualified manpower in the health sector in Nigeriawith emphasis on meeting global standards.

This was unveiled by the Vice Chancellor of Crescent University, Abeokuta, Professor Ibraheem Gbajabiamila during a press conference where he gave highlights on the take-off of College of Health Sciences (COHES) comprising departments of Nursing, Anatomy and Physiology. Gbajabiamila said the issue of health is dated back to the history of how the University Proprietor, Prince Bola Ajibola who has gained more achievement but in the issue of health has not been covered which bring about starting the College of health.

He lamented the high rate of child mortality in Nigeria resulting from lack of improvement in and adequate budget for the health care sector. A situation where the president of a country seeks medical attention beyond the shores of his country is lamentable, he explained.

Where many countries could not meet up with basic amenities in health equipment and facilities during Covid-19 pandemic is a sad story according to

Prof. Gbajabiamila as those countries solely relied on donations from other advanced nations. He added that citizens' health was put in danger because of this ugly scenario.

Recall that most Nigerian elite do not make use of their country's health care facilities as they they prefer going abroad, he made example of Raymond Dokpesi, owner of AIT who almost died of Covid 19 because of insufficient and low-quality health equipment.

According to him, the new college would add more value to the existing colleges namely: College of Natural and Applied Sciences (CONAS), College of Information and Communication Technology (CICOT), Bola Ajibola College of Law

(BACOLAW), College of Arts, Social and Management Sciences (CASMAS), College of Environmental Sciences (COES).

He said the College had been in the pipeline for over three years and that necessary equipments have now been put in place to match international standards.

According to him, UNESCO recommended a ratio of one medical doctor/nurse to six thousand patients which had not been met in many African countries including Nigeria.

The ViceChancellor stated that dearth of qualified health practitioners was responsible for this gap and that Crescent University College of Health Science is poised to fill part of it the yawning gap.

Gbajabiamila said University would follow British curriculum especially for Nursing and Medicine so that qualified doctors could fit into health services worldwide.

He also said part of the challenges facing Nigeria's healthcare is that many professionals in health had travelled abroad for fatter salaries and better working conditions.

He however said since nursing science is a regulated profession, there is a strict number of students to be admitted as dictated by the regulatory bodies. The lives of people should not be put in danger. Hence, the need to admit the few bests into the profession.

he school Registrar is an important personality to the University, the Registrar is the head of a university's record keeping department.

The Crescent University Registrar, Ademola Ajibola in an Interview said the job of a Registrar is bulky with the help of his Assistant and Staff, the work goes smoothly.

In his speech, He said keeping students record confidential is very important, they have the digital and the manual process of keeping the students record. For the manual, it is handled by the Exams and Records department with entrust staffs incharge of the documents without disclosing any documents. Also, the digital documents have a level of access because there is a code attached to it so anybody cannot access the document without the code unless there is a cogent reason.

He further said students record can be accessible to students that need it, and it is not for general only those staff that are in charge can have access to it adding that for students that need to collect the original transcript, it is only available to the institution they chose but there is a student's copy. He added that Crescent University has admitted close to 500 students for the full time and 800 students for the part time which has been largest

population in the University so far.

According to him, different work has been assigned to various departments for example Admission and Academics handled by the Admission office, Students records handled by exams and records, adding that his primary role as the registrar is to assist the Vice Chancellor in the running of the University which include holding management meetings in which matters of priorities are discussed and clearly spelled out in his own records whether digitally or annually and his assistant always keep to his diary.

He however said one of the challenges faced is the volume of many students records and the safety of keeping the record manually, adding that student are the primary stakeholders of the University in terms of the ultimate mission, the Universities are there to produce students and impart them with knowledge in their field.

ACE JOURNALIST, AKEEM LASISI, DELIVERS "MACOSA WEEK" LECTURE ON FAKE NEWS

t is apparent that the effect of fake news is as dangerous as a plague to the society. A lot of damage has been recorded such as damaging people's personality, void against truth, inflaming social conflicts, promoting unverified pieces of news, videos, pictures, voice notes and many more.

As part of activities to mark its week-long programme, the Mass Communication Students' Association (MACOSA) of the Department of Mass Communication, Crescent University, Abeokuta recently hosted an award-winning journalist and poet, Akeem Lasisi who diagnosed the concept of fake news to a large cheering audience. The programme was aimed at all enlightening the university community especially future journalists on dangers of spreading fake news.

The lecture which was held at the Bola Ajibola College of Law lecture hall witnessed the attendance of the head of the department, Dr Kola Adesina, and other prominent lecturers like Dr GaniuOkunnu, Dr Ayo Odetoyinbo, Mrs Bolanle Ismail and MrJamiu Folarin.

Also in attendance were the Public Relations Officer of Crescent University, Mr Idris Katib and Secretary to the Department of Mass Communication, MrSaheed Ganiyu.

Lasisi,a former editorial staff of The Punch Newspapers dwelled extensively on how discover, diagnose and prevent fake news in our society especially on social media.

The programme commenced at exactly 12.00pm with the anchor, WaheedahOyewole, one of the officers of the Association welcoming the guests and student associations from other departments of the university. She also acknowledged the presence of students' bodies from Moshood Abiola Polytechnic...

Perfect decorum was maintained by the audience, including students from Crescent University Political Science

Department, Bola Ajibola College of Law and also students from neighboring polytechnic, Moshood Abiola Polytechnic (MAPOLY) Ogun State.

In respect of the National anthem and the university anthem, were the only dynamic moment aside. Odunbaku

During his lecture, Akeem Lasisi successfully arrested the attention of the audience with explicit definition of terms to open the discussion. as he send pleasantries to his audience. Defining what fake news is, Lasisi pointed out that such news items " are media stories, graphics, videos or audios shared purposely to decieve". He continued that fake news makes it easy to manipulate people's opinions. The two types of fake news he said are Misinformation and Dis-information.

He vividly explained these types of fake news and how they are negatively used on the psyche of their targets.

" Mis-information as a false information shared according to one's thought (thinking it is true) while Dis- information is an information shared intentionally when it is known to be a fake news" said Akeem Lasisi as he listed fake headlines, fake viral posts, satires/mock as examples.

The internationally acclaimed explained that said fake headlines that are catchy and punchy can influence one's decision as well as fake viral posts. He substantiated that satires/mock are stories that make use of irony and metaphor to mislead audience and advised that people needed to be discreet

to be able to perceive about them.

Also, Akeem gave some tips on how to identify fake news and the features of fake news. He analyzed that fake news usually "lacks journalistic principles, lacks grammatical balance and lacks the use of standard sources.

Lasisi emphatically observed that fake news can be fact-checked by:

- * Read past headlines
- * Check other news outlets
- * Check what link and source used
- * Investigate photo and videos

During his contribution, a prominent lecturer in the Department, Mr. JamiuFolarin, listed some of sources for news fact-checking as follows:

- * African check
- * Dubawa
- * Tin eyes
- * Deep fake videos
- * Youtube data viewer

The programme was rounded off after the question and answer session. Both students from Mapoly and Crescent University had the privilege to ask their various questions while the lecturer provided them with adequate answers.

Also questions were asked on the subject matter as students who were able to provide adequate answers went home with beautiful gifts. Adedayo Abraham a student of mass communication 400 level was given a special gift by the guest lecturer Akeem Lasisi for brilliantly and aptly answering the Star Question by the poet.

In order to control the spread of fake news, one needs to be sure about an information before sharing as Lasisi sighted a situation that can cost huge problems. He said" death related news must be verified".

An important action to take after sharing a wrong post is to delete immediately and swiftly apologise. The apology, according to the guest lecturer, is known as corrigendum.

At the beginning of his lecture, Lasisi had modified the intial theme from "Fake News and Fact-checking in Today's Journalism to FAKE NEWS IN THE DIGITAL AGE: MEMO TO ASPIRED JOURNALISTS.

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

ROCKCITY AS THE FIRST PRIVATE RADIO STATION IN OGUN STATE

ockCity FM is the first News, Talk and Entertainment (NTE) station in Nigeria and also the first Independent Radio station in Abeokuta and Ogun State in general. Situated at Asero area of the city, the station operates at sapectrum 101.9 on the FM dial. RockCity101.9FM is owned by BOOT COMMUNICATIONS LTD as duly licensed by the National Broadcasting Commission (NBC).

The Chief Executive Officer of Boot Communications Ltd, operators of ROCKCITY 101.9 FM, Dr NiranMalaolu, a journalist, human right activist and also a former commission r for information and strategy in Ogun State under the erstwhile Otunba Gbenga Daniel led administration.

RockCity FM commenced operation on December 22, 2008 and has since then captured the imagination of listeners in its catchment area; hence it is known as the number one radio station in Ogun State and referred to as "the voice of the people." As the first private radio station in Ogun State, we are a trailblazer. Added to this historical achievement is our flair for innovative programming with emphasis on information and entertainment. The quality of the programmes, coupled with our historical achievements, has not only made us outstanding, but it has also endeared us to

radio listeners in our coverage area so much that we have become, in a very short time, the darling station for all and sundry.

In an interview with one of the pioneer staff of Rock City Mr. Jamiu Folarin, He said Rock City came when people required independent information from that of government only because government media organization only looks at one perspective at the agenda developmental stride of the State Government without looking at the other perspective especially those of the opposition.

laniyi Ganiyu is a Lecturer and Coordinator at the Department of Physical Sciences at Crescent University Abeokuta, He created 'THE POTENTIATES' WhatsApp platform in 2019 for people to showcase their talents and potentials.

WHAT PROMPTED YOU TO CREATE THE ONLINE PLATFORM?

THE POTENTIATES WhatsApp platform is for skills acquisition, information gathering, connecting, collaborating and many more. The idea came from many social related projects I had engaged in, in the past. As a media aficionado, I have involved in a lot of journalistic works like writing of poems, content creation and building, publishing magazines, journals and others. Some of the poems have been used abroad.

I created this platform for people to learn, connect, collaborate and showcase their potentials. THE POTENTIATES platform was establishment on September 4, 2019. That means it has been in existence for about 2 years.

Through the platform, more than twenty other groups have been created for the benefits of humanity. A lot of our members have formed or created their own group through what they have learnt in the group.

HOW CAN PEOPLE THAT HAVE INTEREST JOIN THE PLATFORM?

Initially, when the platform started I added people that I knew and those that have interest. Some left and some stayed. After some months, when people started gaining from the platform, some people joined and within three months, the group reached up to two hundred people on the platform. With the demand to join we are working on extending the platform to Telegram where it could accommodate more people.

IS THE ONLINE PLATFORM MAINLY FOR SOME SET OF PEOPLE OR CAN ANYBODY JOIN THE GROUP?

Yes, anybody can join the group. Students from Crescent University and other Universities joined. There was a time we segmented each month to look at various industries for general knowledge. We had the field of Journalism, Health, Medicine, Dentistry, Social activities, Science and so on. The youth were also given access to express their opinions, talents and skills. Each student was given a topic to speak on. Some of the topics were centered on youth activities, empowerment, enlightenment and knowledge acquisition.

NIN: Fostering Security should not be printed along with contact details on business cards or other office

he National Identification Number (NIN) is the unique number which identifies you for life and is issued to you by NIMC after your enrolment. It is used to match you with your biometric data and other details in the National Identity Database during verification and authentication.

The National Identification Number (NIN) is a set of numbers assigned to an individual upon successful enrolment. Enrolment consists of the recording of an individual's demographic data and capture of the ten (10) fingerprints, headto-shoulder facial picture and digital signature, which are all used to crosscheck existing data in the National Identity Database to confirm that there is no previous entry of the same data.

Once this (de-duplication) process is completed the data is then stored with a unique NIN that was assigned to it. The NIN once issued to a person cannot be used again, (that is, it cannot be issued to another person even if the previous person is dead). It is the NIN that helps to tie all records about a person in the database and is used to check the identity verified.

In a conversation with Sijuoluwa, A LAWSAN students when asked about his view about NIN, He said "NIN is Very Important because so many things will be linked to it such as Bank registration, Driving License and many other crucial details. He concluded his words emphasizing on the benefit of NIN, Narrowing down to Its Security benefit".

The National Identification Number (NIN) is the unique number which identifies you for life and is issued to you by NIMC after your enrolment.

The National Identification Number (NIN) consists of 11 non-intelligible numbers randomly chosen and assigned to an individual at the completion of enrolment into the National Identity Database (NIDB).

Once a NIN is assigned to an individual, it can never be reassigned, given or used by another person - that makes it

In the case of the demise of an individual, his/her NIN is retired once a death certificate is presented to the Commission and the individual's death is established.

The NIN is used to tie all records about an individual in the database and is also used to establish or verify his/her identity.

All citizens and legal residents in Nigeria, from age zero (birth) and above are eligible to enrol for their NINs.

The NIN should be closely guarded by individuals and not revealed to all and sundry except to relevant authorities when requested (for instance it shouldn't be disclosed online over social media and stationery).

Eligibility For NIN

It is mandatory for every citizen and legal resident to enrol for the National Identification Number (NIN). The process is the same whether you choose the selfservice or you require an assisted service.

Minors are not issued with the National Identity cards until they attain the age of 16.

Collection of the NIN

At the completion of the enrolment process, applicant will be issued two (2)

- (a) Transaction Slip
- (b) NIN Slip indicating completion of enrolment.

Why You Need Your NIN

Importantly, the primary purpose of NIN is for identification.


adopted by her school (Online)".

Media and the Entertainment industry (Nollywood and Nigerian Music)

igeria's media and entertainment industry "Nollywood" sprang up in 1992 and is currently the second-largest film producer in the world in terms of number of movies. It is a unifying brand for practitioners in scripting, directing, sound, High Definition (HD) techniques, acting, cinematography, make-up, editing, etc. The Nollywood industry is articulated around a few major production centers like Lagos, Onitsha, Enugu, Asaba and Abuja. The distribution of the films also hinges on these same production centers as well as other major distribution points in Nigeria such as Aba.

Business opportunities in the Nollywood industry include opening of cinemas in underserved cities, use of technological platforms to enhance distribution e.g. Iroko TV and Netflix, training and capacity building for cinematography, scriptwriting and directing, and movie production equipment.

The music sector of Nigeria's entertainment industry also recorded significant growth over the years. The

stakeholders include artists, musicians, producers, promoters, managers, distributors, marketers, etc. In the past six years, the growing numbers of new production studios and artists springing up has paved way for a more vibrant and selfsustaining industry. Others have won prestigious awards in international contests and events, hence attracting more and more investments from very many sources. The investments have no doubt aided production of world-class quality music because of innovations in sounds, rhythms and recording techniques. Pacesetters, Nigerian musicians have developed a vast Nigerian genres.

Challenges in the Media and Entertainment Sector

The impact of COVID necessitated the lockdown which has led to many media businesses being unable to pay salaries and down-sizing because of high cost of operations. Newspaper Proprietors Association of Nigeria (NPAN), Broadcasting Organizations of Nigeria (BON) and Nigerian Union of Journalists (NUJ) are currently making an appeal to the

Internet Penetration Rate: In response to the low level of internet connectivity which hampers the digitization of business, Nigerian Communications has established laws and guidelines aimed at promoting increased access to the Internet through the already licensed Infrastructure Companies (InfraCos) and other initiatives in order to heighten Internet access by the people of Nigeria.

LET'S TALK ABOUT HYPERTENSION

ypertension is a silent killer because the heart works hard to move blood through the blood vessels. It contributes to the hardening of the arteries which decrease of blood and oxygen flow to the heart. When left untreated, HBP can lead to heart attack, heart failure, stroke, erectile dysfunction, kidney failure and irregular heartbeat.

Hypertension is more common in people who are more than 60 years of age. Blood pressure can increase steadily with age as the arteries stiffen and narrow due to

plaque buildup.

What are common symptoms of hypertension?

Hypertension is called a "silent killer". Most people with hypertension are unaware of the problem because it may have no warning signs or symptoms. For this reason, it is essential that blood pressure is measured regularly.

When symptoms do occur, they can include early morning headaches, nosebleeds, irregular heart rhythms, vision changes, and buzzing in the ears. Severe



hypertension can cause fatigue, nausea, vomiting, confusion, anxiety, chest pain, and muscle tremors.

The only way to detect hypertension is to have a health professional measure blood pressure. Having blood pressure measured is quick and painless. Individuals can also measure their own blood pressure using automated devices, however, an evaluation by a health professional is important for assessment of risk and associated conditions.

How can the burden of hypertension be reduced?

Reducing hypertension prevents heart attack, stroke, and kidney damage, as well as other health problems.

Prevention

- * Reducing salt intake (to less than 5g daily)
- * Eating more fruits and vegetables
- * Being physically active on a regular basis
- * Avoiding use of tobacco
- * Reducing alcohol consumption
- * Limiting the intake of foods high in saturated fats
- * Eliminating/reducing trans fats in diet

Managing Hypertension

- * Reducing and managing mental stress
- * Regularly checking blood pressure
- * Treating high blood pressure
- * Managing other medical conditions

A person can measure their blood pressure at home with a wrist blood pressure monitor. These devices may be useful for people with high blood pressure as they can take regular readings and help an individual manage blood pressure accordingly. It may also be possible to share monitor results with a doctor if necessary.

Keeping your blood pressure within normal, healthy limits can help you live a longer life. That's because high blood pressure, or hypertension, raises your risk of some seriously life.

WOMEN HEALTH: Yeast Infection

aginal yeast infection commonly known as vulvovaginal candidiasis is a disease condition characterized by itchy vaginal discharge, caused by an organism called candida app, for example candida albicans among all others. The infection which accounts for about 84% of vaginal infections, in some study it affects up to 25% of women. The infection can cause discomfort and result to other issues like infertility when untreated.

The high rate of report/ reported cases on the recurrence of the infection sky rocket daily.

It is important to prevent an over growth of the natural vaginal yeast. The following could be done to treat vaginal yeast infection; good personal hygiene and options of therapy which includes intra vaginal preparation and oral agents, compromising the Azoles e.g clotrimazole, miconazole which will be appropriately prescribed by the physician. However, if you experience yeast infection the first time, it's super important to follow through on your treatment regime. It's clear that recurrent yeast infections are sometimes complicated and require specialized treatment.

In an interview with Assistant Chief Nursing officer in Abeokuta MrsOgunjimiAtinukeOluwatoyin, she said.

"Ignorance is a problem facing the populace and misconception, people needs to be educated and re-educated on health related conditions". MrsOgunjimiAtinuke described how you will know if you have yeast infection, she said through; irritation, excess discharge, Yellowish discharge, Itching, discharge smell bad and many others

She however explain the consequences of untreated yeast and that it is advisable to go for Laboratory test confirms the presence of yeast infection. Among the implications of untreated yeast are: It can lead to discomfort, Candidiasis, severe itching, Leading to skin cracking, Increasing the infection. And Infertility can occur both primary and secondary.

It is advisable to know the discomforts caused by yeast infection, these are Irritability , Bad odour, skin cracks and sore, Pain during intercourse, while urinating, swelling of the vulva as well as redness of the skin.

Rather than panics, yeast infection is treatable and so many ways could be used to prevent the re-occurrence. Here are the ways to prevent yeast infections:

Practice good hygiene

 $\hbox{*We ar cotton or silk underwear, which allows dampness to evaporate, unlike nylon and other synthetics.}$

*Wash and dry your underwear thoroughly and change them often to prevent dampness.

- *Don't wear a wet bathing suit for any length of time.
- *Don't use douches or deodorant feminine hygiene sprays.
- *Don't leave tampons or sanitary pads in place for a long time.
- *Eat yogurt that contains active cultures to add to the good bacteria that help your body control yeast.

TWITTER BAN

hen the federal government of Nigeria banned Twitter on June 4, it gave no thought to the importance of the platform.

All that mattered was the bruised ego of President MuhammaduBuhari, who felt insulted because his tweet—in which he had threatened to "treat those misbehaving today in a language they understand"—was deleted for violating Twitter's policy and his account temporarily suspended.

But millions of Nigerians, especially young people, rely on social media platforms. They're trying to use tech and social media to solve local problems in Nigeria, from entertainment to health to fin-tech. In 2019, there were about 24.59 million social network users in Nigeria, a figure projected to grow to 44.63 million users in 2025 as more and more users are able to access the internet and others begin to understand the role that social media plays in business, job creation, advocacy, and politics.

In April, Twitter announced that it was setting up operations in Ghana. In the statement announcing their decision, the company stated that Ghana is a supporter of free speech, online freedom, and open internet. The move itself was unsurprising. During the #EndSARS protests against police brutality, oppression, and extrajudicial



arrests and killings which were held across various states in Nigeria and the diaspora in October 2020, Twitter amplified the hashtag, which quickly gained traction and trended across multiple countries, with CEO Jack Dorsey sharing donation links to funding the protests across Nigeria. This,

afterwards, prompted a discourse on regulating social media by Lai Mohammed—Nigeria's minister of information and culture—and some northern governors.

Twitter has been at the forefront of the Nigerian social media revolution. It has a large number of young users, unhindered from airing their opinions. It was especially critical in organizing and crowd funding for the #EndSARS protests in October 2020. That may be why the government was quick to impose a ban on the slightest provocation. In a recent interview, Buhari was reminded that Nigeria is losing foreign direct investment to neighbors like Ghana. The president was asked what his administration—with two years to go—can do to make the country a more competitive and attractive destination for foreign direct investment. The president started by saying, "This question was answered when there was this #EndSARS. You remember the young people who wanted to march there and remove me?" The implication that the main threat to the country was a threat to him personally speaks volumes.
